

NOTES ON TODAY'S MUSIC

This morning's prelude is the hymn tune, "Detroit" and was composed for "Kentucky Harmony", a shape note hymnal published in Harrisonburg, Virginia, circa 1820. The text is drawn from Psalm 54 which begins: "Save me, O God, by thy name, and judge me by thy strength. Hear my prayer, O God; give ear to the words of my mouth." This morning's offertory is one of those hymns that has also fared well as a folk song and even as a Western song. The song was known before the U.S. Civil War. A dying Union soldier inscribed the text on the walls of Richmond's Libby Prison in 1862. This poignant song, especially as arranged by Mark Hayes, is a good fit for the Lenten Season.
