We give you thanks and we give you praise.

Righteous God, for your Holy Spirit,

Who refreshes our hearts,

Who fills us until we overflow with abundance of joy, love, and peace,

We give you thanks and we give you praise.

Eternal God, for your Son Jesus the Christ,

In whom you have delivered us,

In whom you have forgiven us,

In whom you have reconciled us and given us life everlasting,

We give you thanks and we give you praise.

Bless One Another:

Let us go out into the world, recognizing that God leads us, calls us, giving us hands to do God's work in the world. And may the grace and reconciling love of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you and seen in all that you do.
