

NOTES ON TODAY'S MUSIC

The text of this morning's prelude hymn was written in 1745 by a Welsh Calvinist. The tune was composed more than 150 years later by a railroad man who was a Welsh Baptist. This very Welsh hymn is so well known that it appears in more than 1,750 hymnals. Today's offertory begins with French composer, Claude Debussy's "Reverie", a contemplative piece, circa 1890. Once again, Mark Hayes embeds a vintage hymn in his treatment of this classic piece. This old hymn written by a Baptist minister in 1864, is reappearing in newer hymnals. Inspired by Revelation 22:1, it uses the imagery of a river and the concept of restoration and reward as it describes a crystal-clear river flowing with the water of life-- much like the living water Jesus offered to the woman at the well.
