

INFORMATION FOR OUR GUESTS


To get the most out of your visit, may we recommend you familiarize yourself with the following:

NOTES ON TODAY'S MUSIC

"Wade In the Water" has its roots in Antebellum African American music and was likely used in signaling and communicating along the Underground Railroad. At the dawn of the 20th Century, the Fisk Jubilee Singers of Nashville's historic Black College helped to popularize the song in their national concert tours. Soon after, mainstream hymnals began to include the piece and associate it with baptism. It's third verse declares, "If you don't believe I've been redeemed, Just follow me down to Jordan's stream. God's gonna trouble the waters." Today's offertory is a Gaelic tune that originally set a Christmas Carol. It may be best known in and out of church as "Morning Has Broken" but on this Sunday in January, with its focus on Baptism, the 1981 text found as #482 in our hymnal is a wonderful fit.
