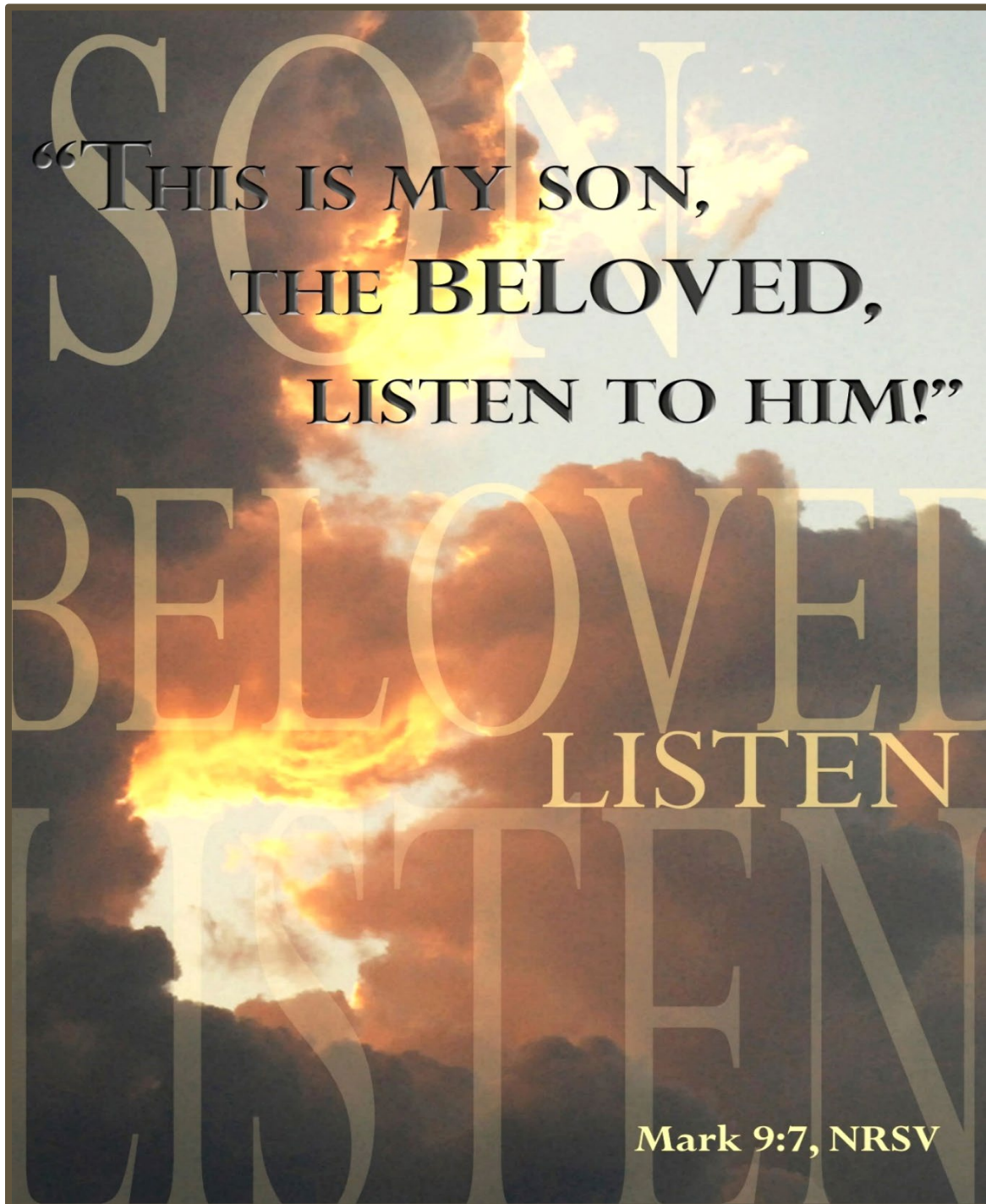

INFORMATION FOR OUR GUESTS

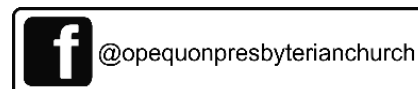
To get the most out of your visit, may we recommend you familiarize yourself with the following:

NOTES ON TODAY'S MUSIC

This morning's prelude combines a 15th Century Latin text with *Deo Gracias (Agincourt Song)*, a 15th century English tune of celebration. If you read the text of this hymn (#185) you'll see today's Gospel Lesson told as a ballad. Transfiguration Sunday is a day to remember a lesson from Sunday School; the light of Jesus also shines through us. Many of us could sing "This Little Light of Mine" even before we could properly manage a crayon. You probably never sang it while sitting still. It's likely you've never listened to a vocal or instrumental arrangement of it without at least moving your head or tapping your foot. Get ready to do both this morning as you hear Mark Hayes' arrangement of this song whose roots are unknown. Copies of the song began to appear here and there around 1923 – soon it was everywhere!

ANNUAL MEETING OF THE CONGREGATION

All active members of Opequon are encouraged to participate in this meeting, exercising both the privilege and responsibility of church membership, as we give thanks for our ministry and mission as the called people of God.

Back in 2020, Ann died in a tragic car accident and Wayne was severely injured. In a moment, Wayne’s life was changed! In the dark, dark time that followed, the promise of Isaiah 41:10 became his support: “Fear not, for I am with you; be not dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you. Yes, I will help you, I will uphold you with my righteous hand.” Wayne survived that darkness. In grateful response to this positive effect the words of Isaiah 41:10 have had upon his life, Wayne has had bookmarks printed with this passage and given them to all the church’s and members of Shenandoah Presbytery.
