

## **INFORMATION FOR OUR GUESTS**


To get the most out of your visit, may we recommend you familiarize yourself with the following:

# **NOTES ON TODAY'S MUSIC**

The melody heard in this morning's prelude can be traced to the 14<sup>th</sup> Century but there is strong evidence that it may be much older and have roots in an ancient folksong. Sometime around 1600, the German composer, Michael Praetorius, arranged the tune in the typical hymn form we still use. Today's middle hymn uses Praetorius' arrangement to set one of the earliest hymn texts written for a specific season of the Christian year. The organist's interpretation of Lani Smith's arrangement is meant to harken back to the melody's folk roots. The tune is light and joyous and perfect for whistling or humming as you go about your day. In 1747, Charles Wesley began one of his 6500 hymn texts with: "Love divine, all loves excelling, joy of heav'n, to earth come down, fix in us thy humble dwelling," and in today's offertory, it is paired with the well-known Welsh tune, *Hyfrydol*.
