INFORMATION FOR OUR GUESTS


To get the most out of your visit, may we recommend you familiarize yourself with the following:

NOTES ON TODAY'S MUSIC

In the 14th chapter of John's gospel, Jesus says: "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you..." Peace between nations; peace between neighbors; peace in our family; peace in our soul—each is worthy of prayer. The title of this morning's prelude prompts us to pray for peace and Paul Taylor's composition aids us in that endeavor. "He's Got the Whole World in His Hands" may be a children's song that adults love to sing, or it may be an adult song that children can easily sing. While its roots likely lie among other old spirituals there is no record of it being published before 1927. It caught on quickly. Many well-known singers have released their version. It's been a favorite of folksingers, Bible School openings, and car trips. Although it's found in only a handful of hymnals this simple song of faith and witness is surprisingly ubiquitous. It's fitting that it would be known and sung throughout "... the whole wide world."
